# From the desk of the Pastor

My dear Parish family, I am very pleased to provide you with a spiritual report and a financial report this week (See pg.8). Last fiscal year was another blessed time for us as a Parish family. In an even greater way, our spiritual blessings have been abundant. Although we are seeing a sharp decline in the number of children being baptized and coming to all of the Sacraments, we are seeing a strong increase in the participation of our youth at St. Greg's.

Last year we celebrated 81 Baptisms, 115 children for First Penance, 110 children for First Holy Communion, 139 teenagers for Confirmation and 13 Weddings at St. Greg's. We also received 13 people to the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil through the RCIA process. On the other hand we celebrated 156 funerals, clearly you can see we are burying about twice as many as we are Baptizing. This is not only a phenomenon at St. Greg's, but is consistent throughout the Diocese. I believe this year we will have similar numbers for the Sacraments, however we are recognizing a decreased number of people celebrating Mass and becoming involved within the Parish, beyond Sunday Mass.

The Diocese of Buffalo is simply getting smaller and the current crisis in our Church is not helping matters. Many have pulled away from the Parish and from the Church altogether. Some Parishioners attend Mass but refuse to contribute any longer and some, even though upset and angered over the abuse crisis, continue to do what they have always done in their involvement and support of the Parish. I thank everyone for continuing to come to the Sacraments and I especially thank those who are continuing to support the Parish with their time, talent and treasure.

On a very positive side, I feel we are more alive than ever! I am now in the last year of my six year term as your Pastor and I marvel at where we have come spiritually. I see a real renaissance in

our Catholic School. We are blessed to have many young families investing in a Catholic Education at St. Gregory the Great School. These young families are not only coming to our school, but are involved in our Parish family and regularly celebrating the Eucharist. This has not always been the case. Similarly, I also see a strong Family Faith Formation program with many families who are extremely dedicated to our Faith and a Sacramental life. (Continued on page 2)

### (From the desk of the Pastor Continued)

From my experience at St. Greg's I must say that our Church has a bright future with great youth leaders emerging especially from our Family Faith Formation and Youth Ministry programs. When I was first ordained, almost 27 years ago, most of our teen leaders came from Catholic high schools. Today, at St. Greg's, it is a mix of both our public and Catholic school youth stepping up to be involved in our Parish.

Our Youth Ministry program is top shelf. When I arrived we had a very small Life Teen program mostly attended by Confirmation candidates who "had to attend." We had a failing junior-high youth ministry with a small handful of kids, and plans to begin a young adult ministry. Today we have three full time youth ministers: one for junior-high, one for high school and one for college and young adults. We are serving and engaging our youth more and more each day. Our junior- high program recently launched a 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grade ministry which is thriving and so is our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Edge program. There are well over 100 junior-high students regularly involved and another hundred high school teens involved in our Life Teen program. About a year ago we launched a college and young adult ministry. This ministry has grown and recently over 40 young adults participated in a weekend retreat. We had 15 college age and young adult men begin a 90 day spiritual program of scriptural reflection, prayer, fasting and a commitment to a simple life in order to grow spiritually through sacrifice. We are blessed!

We need to focus on those who have fallen away from faith. About one-third of our Parish family has not attended Mass or been involved in our Parish. Again, this is not a unique problem to St. Greg's, but one for concern nonetheless. We have over 2000 registered families who have had no contact with St. Greg's in the last two years. We need to reach out to our brothers and sisters in Christ. We desperately need to hire a Director of Evangelization. This is a specialized area of ministry where someone would address all of the issues, one-on-one, with those who are inactive in Faith. I am thankful to Father Thomas Maloney for his willingness to lead an effort in this area, but I am also aware that a part time "retired" priest cannot accomplish all we need to in a Parish of this size. I urge you to pray for those who have fallen away, and consider sacrificing even more in your contributions to allow us to hire a full time Director of Evangelization. In my opinion, this is the next major task to address. We have worked well together to accomplish all we have done with our youth and now, without losing that, we need to address Evangelization.

As always, I thank each of you for all that you do for St. Gregory the Great Parish. I humbly request you to consider increasing your weekly offering to help us work through the 18% shortfall we are experiencing now in regards to the collection, and to allow us to consider the much needed Evangelization ministry. May God bless you, may our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

# Respect Life

The Reproductive Health Act (RHA) Becomes

Law: From the NYS Catholic Conference: "New York State has added a sad chapter to [the] already solemn date of January 22, the anniversary of Roe v. Wade. With the legislature's passage, and Governor Cuomo's signing of the Reproductive Health Act, our beloved state has become a more dangerous one for women and their unborn babies.

Many of the state Senators and Assembly members who voted for this abortion expansion are mothers themselves, who felt their child toss, turn and kick in their womb, and delighted in the progress of their pregnancy. Many others, as well as our governor, are fathers, who held their partner's hand as they viewed the ultrasound videos, watched their child squirm and rejoiced at the first sound of a heartbeat. Many of these same officials were themselves born into less -than-perfect conditions - poverty, health problems, disabilities, broken families. All overcame these issues to rise to leadership in our state, because their parents chose life for them.

We thank all our partners in the 12-year-long fight to stop this horrendous policy, and all pro-life New Yorkers who made their voices heard in an effort to stop it. Let us all pray for the conversion of heart for those who celebrate this tragic moment in the history of our state. And we pray in a special way for the lives that will be lost, and for the women of our state who are made less safe under this law."

Bishop Richard Malone added, "NYS is already the state with the highest rate of killing pre-born children through abortion. This is a tragic day for NYS that makes a very bad situation even worse. It is a barbaric action of our legislature, and clearly nothing to celebrate."
