From the desk of the Pastor

My Dear Parish Family, As we celebrate this weekend I would like to address some practical points. The first point is our church renovation. The work is progressing along nicely. One part of our project that we did not include in the project is the need for new sanctuary furnishings. Simply stated, our liturgical furnishings are tired, broken and glued together or simply worn out. Like moving into a new home, we often will purchase new furniture and furnishings to match the new environment; the same is true for our church.

The time has come to purchase new liturgical furnishings to match each other and refresh the sanctuary. To that end, I have ordered the following items which can be memorialized. Each item will have a donor plaque stating who it is given by or in memory of. I ask you to call Jo Pierino at our Parish Office if you are interested in memorializing any of these items:

- 1. (6) Candle holders for the altar area. Two to be used at Mass in procession and the others to be used in various ways at Christmas, Easter and special celebrations. These are \$3000.00 each.
- 2. (1) Processional Cross and Stand for \$3500.00
- 3. (1) Paschal Candle Holder for \$3500.00
- 4. (1) Incense censor and stand for \$3500.00
- 5. (1) Set of Bells for use at Consecration for \$800.00

A second thought to share this week: I am sure you would agree that there is a sharp polarization in our society. There is a growing divide in our country as a whole and within many organizations.

In addition to the polarization, there is also a movement to direct all concerns, questions, complaints and issues to leadership rather than to begin with the person directly involved and work your way up the list. Our experience of Parish Life mirrors this trend.

On January 10, the Eighth Grade class of St. Gregory's participated in a Day of Recollection. This Day of Recollection was carefully organized by the Youth Ministry Team of the school, led by Adam Jarosz and Nicole Janecek. Students participated in games and activities, along with attending the 12:00 noon Mass, and ended the day in Adoration at the church. It was a cheerful and fulfilling experience for the students. While we had fun, we also learned many things about our faith and ourselves.

To start the day, the class joined together in the Ministry Center. This is where most of the day's activities took place. Nicole directed several group games we could enjoy. Some of these included Ships and Sailors, Just Dance, Simon Says, and a Rock Paper Scissors tournament. We were also given free time in the gym. Here, we were able to participate in sports and group games together. These activities included frisbee, volleyball, four square, and basketball. One of the best parts of having this retreat for the eighth graders was that our class as a whole was able to spend time together outside of the classroom. PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

Have you considered giving a prayer shawl to someone you know who is going through difficult or challenging circumstances in life? Our shawls, made by hand with love and prayer, can be given to anyone who is going through physical pain from surgery, rehab after surgery, acute and chronic illnesses, especially cancer with surgery and subsequent chemotherapy. Those suffering from emotional pain from the loss of a loved one, divorce, dementia, depression or family conflict can also benefit from the warmth, consolation and connection with God's love that a blessed shawl can often provide. 
