From the desk of the Pastor

My Dear Parish Family, this weekend we are reminded in the first reading from Sirach, that "The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had." The Gospel from Luke reaffirms the same reality that "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit." So, what kind of tree are you? What fruit do you bear? Does the fruit of your life indicate that you belong to God the Father or to someone/something else? St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians encourages us to be "devoted to the work of the Lord."

What kind of "fruit" indicates that we are part of the orchard of the Lord? We need to look earlier in the book of Sirach 2:1-11 to find a pretty clear answer. Sirach reminds us to stand in justice and to "fear" (which really means to honor and revere) the Lord. Our heart, according to this passage, is to be sincere and steadfast. We are to search for understanding and be undisturbed in a time of adversity. Sirach reminds us to wait on God, be patient, to cling to God and not to forsake Him. The "fruit" must include times of sorrow which calls us to be steadfast, trusting of God's direction and waiting for His mercy. Hope is a "fruit" of a person in the orchard of the Lord.

Understanding is probably one of the most needed and rarely found "fruits" today. You may agree that many individuals are entrenched in their own opinion and personal belief. This entrenchment often eclipses understanding. There are different facets to "understanding."

Among the many phrases my Mother often used was this one: "One protests too much, doesn't one?" This phrase translates to mean that because someone was complaining so much, there is something deeper going on. That "deeper" level may be the fact that they themselves are guilty of whatever they are protesting or that their anger or protest is because there is a deeper hurt that needs to be healed. The protest or anger is really a mask covering up a deeper hurt. This is a level of understanding.

I recall an incident where someone came to my office to complain about my regular mentioning of abortion and complained that I need to let people make up their own minds on these political matters. There were many other angry statements also mentioned in her remarks. As I sat listening, I kept getting the understanding in my heart that there was a deeper issue and her anger was really a mask for something else. Going out on a limb, after she aired her concerns, I simply asked, "So when did you have an abortion and would you like to talk about that?" She broke into tears because she was not angry with me, nor angry at the church or God, but angry with herself because she had come to realize she had taken a human life. She masked her need for healing and forgiveness with anger and protest. "One protests too much, doesn't one?" In our conversations with one another, do we really search to understand one another or do we search to convince one another of some point? Are we masking the real issues? (Continued on Page 2)

The same is true with our understanding of God. Do we really try to understand the virtues put forward by God in the Scripture or do we look for flaws? On January 29, 2019, an Associated Press article contained a quote from an elected official who stated: "I have my own Catholic beliefs, how I live my life. ... That is my business as a Catholic. ... I don't govern as a Catholic. I don't legislate as a Catholic." This is a very interesting statement because it cuts to the question as to what is the very central core of the person. Each person can only have one central core, one understanding or perspective that becomes the pool from which an individual makes decisions.

Understanding includes the understanding of the person. Each person must understand their basic pool of values or virtues as well as their origin. For example, my pool of virtues is those defined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. My speech and action are rooted in Gospel values. I would assume that the elected official quoted above, may espouse some Catholic virtues, but the "catechism" he follows would be from the understanding of a particular political pool of thought rather than Gospel thought. Today, I fear many individual's understanding is rooted in an amalgamation of thoughts that they have accepted as true from a variety of sources. As Catholics, our virtues are rooted in faith and become our point of understanding; for others, a political party dictates the window of understanding and under relativism, each person creates their own reality of understanding as they become the judge of what is virtuous or not. The relativist defines virtue for him/her self and will not accept an understanding of virtue defined by an institution or body like the church or political or social group.

What is your "understanding" and how does your understanding of life influence your ability to understand the lives of others? This is a great question to ponder as we proceed towards Lent. Lent calls us to have the understanding of Christ's life, teaching, passion, death and resurrection and to live it ourselves today. As St. Paul writes, "May I, in my life, make up for what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ." This means may I continue to live in my life the understanding of Christ regardless of the cost. This may be the cross we are called to mediate upon this Lent. As we prepare for Ash Wednesday and Lent, consider if your fruit is the understanding of Christ's?

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

LENTEN OBSERVANCES

Abstinence: All Catholics 14 and older are to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays in Lent.

Fasting: All Catholics between 18 and 60 years of age are to observe the Law of Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day. The faithful are invited to add voluntary fasting to the practice of penance during the Fridays of Lent. Together with works of charity and service toward our neighbors, this practice would become a sign of our commitment to conversion, reconciliation and peace.

Easter Duty: After being initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all Catholics are to receive Communion at least once a year. This must be fulfilled during the Easter Season, between March 10 (First Sunday of Lent) and June 16 (Trinity Sunday), unless, for a good reason, it is fulfilled at another time of year.

SEVEN CHURCHES BUS TRIP



Respect Life

The Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act: Legislation introduced into the US Senate by Sen. Ben Sasse (R-NE) has failed to achieve the 60 votes necessary to overcome a Democrat-led filibuster and bring the legislation to the floor for a vote. The Senate voted 53 to 44, largely along party lines, and fell short of the of the two-thirds majority needed to move the bill forward.

The "Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act" would have penalized doctors or other medical professionals who do not provide medical care to infants who are born alive following a botched abortion attempt. The bill does not restrict abortion rights but is designed to prevent infanticide.

Both New York Senators, Sen. Charles Schumer and presidential candidate Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand voted to defeat the bill.

Several Democratic senators spoke against the bill saying it would force doctors to provide care against the "reproductive rights" and "choices" of women.

Senator Sasse created the legislation in response to comments by Virginia Gov. Ralph Northam (D) that appeared to endorse neglecting infants who survived late-term abortions. Northam's spokesperson later said that the governor was only referring to infants with "severe" birth defects or other disabilities.

While uncommon, there have been many documented cases of infants surviving abortions. Former abortionist Kermit Gosnell is currently serving a life sentence after he was found to have murdered numerous infants who were born alive after surviving attempted late-term abortions. The Reproductive Health Act (RHA), recently signed into law by Governor Cuomo, removed <u>all</u> language from the NY Penal Code that specifically protected babies born alive in failed abortion procedures.




