From the desk of the Pastor

My Dear Parish Family, Alleluia!! He is Risen!! Alleluia!! It is a joy for us to celebrate Easter once again and a particular joy to celebrate Easter in our newly renovated church.

What does Easter call us to recognize and celebrate? It is clear from the Gospels that most people who encountered the Resurrected Lord Jesus Christ did not recognize Him. Mary Magdalene thought he was the gardener at first, and some of the apostles thought Him a ghost, and those walking to Emmaus saw him as a fellow traveler. Most did not recognize Him at first. Oddly enough it appears that as much as Thomas is dubbed as “doubting,” when he finally encountered our Risen Lord a week later he recognized Him. Maybe he knew Him because Jesus showed him His hands and side and told him to believe and not to persist in disbelief. We know that when each individual finally recognized the Risen Jesus, their lives were radically changed.

Mary Magdalene’s life was changed when she recognized Jesus. She celebrated with great joy, ran to tell the apostles and joyfully shared the news with others. Peter and “the other disciple” ran to the tomb.

The “other disciple” outran Peter but waited for him to arrive and Peter was the first of the apostles to recognize the Resurrection and understanding that “God raised Him on the third day and made Him manifest; “not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses...” (Acts 10:34a, 37-43). Peter, who denied our Lord three times just a few days earlier, celebrates the Resurrection and confidently assumes his role as the Vicar of Christ (the Pope) and leads the newly forming Body of Christ.

In the Emmaus story we know that the disciples walking on the road to Emmaus are deeply troubled over the crucifixion and are aware of the Resurrection and the astounding news that Jesus’ body was not in the tomb. Yet with all of that they still leave Jerusalem and walk to Emmaus. What could be so important in Emmaus? They were discussing the events as they walked and actually were stunned when the Risen Jesus, who they did not recognize, appeared to be unaware of the “events in Jerusalem.” These disciples recounted the passion and death of Christ and then, still not recognizing the risen Jesus, Jesus begins to explain the Scripture. As they arrived in Emmaus they begged Jesus to stay with them and finally recognized Him in the “breaking of the bread” or the Eucharist as we know it today. This recognition caused them to celebrate by running, as did Mary Magdalene and Peter and the “other disciple,” to tell the story. What do you recognize and celebrate this Easter? Have you “run” to tell someone about your experience of the risen Messiah? Do you speak with confidence, as did Peter, about Christ in your life? How is it that you celebrate, not just the food and tradition of Easter Sunday, but celebrate your faith in Jesus Christ each and every day?

This Easter, I encourage you to share your own experience of recognizing Jesus as Lord, Savior and Messiah with at least your own family. Many families on Thanksgiving Day gather at the table to celebrate thanks to God with a meal, and at the gathering celebrate by each person speaking what they are most thankful for in life. Easter is another time we gather with family to share a meal. This Easter consider inviting each person at the table to take a turn sharing their faith in the Risen Lord. It may feel awkward at first because many people are not accustomed to sharing such personal faith knowledge and experience, but this is a way that we are called to give witness to the Resurrection in this place and time. We hear the apostles and early disciples tell us: “We are witnesses to all that He did!” We, in 2019, in Buffalo, New York are called to state the same: “We are witnesses to all that He did!”

We often think of the word “witness” with a court room. We can watch many television shows based on court room proceedings or on police investigations which ultimately look for the people who are able to witness what they saw or heard. The Greek word for “witness” is best translated as “martyr.”

Every age of the Church has had the formal “martyrs” arise. Martyrs are the most courageous men and women of faith who give their very lives for Jesus Christ rather than renounce knowing Him. We recognize the martyrs from among the original twelve apostles through every century of time to the present moment. Who are the martyrs today? Believe it or not, daily people are martyred for the faith, especially in the Middle East. We do not hear it regularly on the news channels, but it is happening. Do you remember July 26, 2016 when two Islamist terrorists attacked a congregation during Mass in Saint -Etienne-du-Rouvray, Normandy? It was there that Father Jacques Hamel was martyred and others wounded as they would not renounce their faith in Jesus Christ. The call of Martyrdom exists today.

Are you willing to be martyred as a witness to Christ? Perhaps you will not be called to bloodshed, but we are all called to the “martyrdom” of social pain, criticism, and harsh comments as we stand for the truth of the risen Lord Jesus in its entirety and not simply what is politically correct or polite to state. What is it you recognize and celebrate this Easter? Do you recognize your call to be a witness, to be a martyr, and to experience suffering in the name of Jesus today?

If so, do you do it with the same joy of Mary Magdalene, Peter, the “other disciple” and the disciples on the road to Emmaus?

On behalf of Fathers Tom, Paul, Thomas and Barry and on behalf of Sister Shawn and Deacons Michael and Paul, and on behalf of our entire ministerial and professional support team of St. Gregory the Great, I wish you a Blessed Easter and a renewed understanding of what we recognize and celebrate and give witness to this Easter Sunday and every day of our lives. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

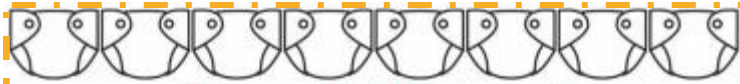

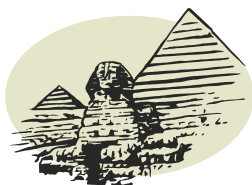

STUDENT REFLECTION
