From The Desk of the Deacon Michael Bochiechio

My Brothers and Sisters of St. Greg's,

At the end of Mass, some parishioners have asked what else I do besides serve as a Deacon at Masses on the weekend. Well for starters, I have a Monday through Friday job at the Erie County Department of Social Services. Currently I work in the Community Medicaid Division of Public Health in the Rath Building at 95 Franklin Street.

Upon graduating from Christ the King Seminary in 2009 with a Masters Degree in Pastoral Ministry, and being ordained a Permanent Deacon by Bishop Kmiec, I was assigned to Gateway Longview as my "out of the parish" ministry. I have been volunteering in Spiritual Life at Gateway–Longview, offering youth who are there a "Spiritual" aspect to their stay. Gateway–Longview is a Methodist-based facility and has a spiritual component in addition to the other services offered. For the youth residents, participation in the programs that Spiritual Life provides is voluntary.

On any given Tuesday night, I am in the Robert Burns Lynde Memorial Chapel were you most likely will hear Rap-Worship music playing, and although this may be unconventional to some, the residents respond well. I lead a non-denominational chapel service starting with music followed by a Scripture reading, and most often a modern day film that incorporates the Gospel teachings of Saints Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. We conclude with a reflective spiritual discussion on how the teachings of Jesus are alive in today's world and how that theme is reflected in the movie.

Utilizing skills I learned at Christ the King Seminary, I use an open mind and door to meet these young men where they are at that moment in time, offering them a glimmer of hope to enable them to envision a way to change their lives for the better.

For me personally, it is like planting a flower garden from a handful of seeds. You are not sure what type of flowers the seeds will grow into and you may be surprised on how they blossom and grow. That is very rewarding to me!

Through the weekly services there is an opportunity for youth to explore their own spirituality, and I attempt to show them the stepping stones for them to grow spiritually. Life is a journey for all of us and we each need to be that stepping stone for each other. My prayer is that I am able to help these young men see that their time at Gateway–Longview can be the first stepping stone on their journey to a new start in their lives. Please keep me in your prayers as I spread the Gospel to the residents at this facility. Amen.



On December 16, 2017, our lives were forever changed. My heart was shattered. My family was devastated. That was the day my oldest son, Devin, took his own life, just three months after his 18th birthday. To say that I was blindsided would be an understatement. Devin was an incredibly gifted athlete. He was dedicated to keeping himself fit and planned on enlisting in the Marine Corps this June.

Devin's true gift, however, was his presence. He could walk into a room and not only light it up but control it with his mere being. Devin had a way about him that drew people in. He had more friends than one could imagine, and he loved every one of them. When I look at the faces of those kids and see

the impact which Devin's death had on so many, I know that I must do something to try to spare another family from experiencing the same pain that we are living through.

Unfortunately, stories like my family's are far too common. Stories like Devin's happen more than anyone wants to talk about. Suicide is the second leading cause of death for kids aged 10–24. More teenagers and young adults die from suicide than from cancer, heart disease, AIDS, birth defects, stroke, pneumonia, influenza, and chronic lung disease, COMBINED.

This is the reason we are hosting **Drive for Devin**. On Friday, July 27, 2018 a 9-hole golf tournament in Devin's memory will be played at Deerwood Golf Course in North Tonawanda, followed by a dinner at Classics V on Niagara Falls Blvd. The money raised from this tournament will go to support children, teens and adults in their time of crisis. Crisis Services provides treatment and assistance to people in emotional crisis through a variety of therapeutic services. I want people to know that help is always there if they find themselves in crisis." **You Are Never Alone.**"

From Married Life and the Gift of Love (USCCB, 2006): "Natural methods of family planning involve fertility education that enables couples to cooperate with the body as God designed it.

"Married love differs from any other love in the world. By its nature, the love of husband and wife is so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with God and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being they will love and care for together. Part of God's gift to husband and wife is this ability in and through their love to cooperate with God's creative power. Therefore, the mutual gift of... [t]hat power to create a new life with God is at the heart of what spouses share with each other. Suppressing fertility by using contraception denies part of the inherent meaning of married sexuality and does harm to the couple's unity. The total giving of oneself, body and soul, to one's beloved is no time to say: 'I give you everything I am— except...'
