Joe Couche is a newer parishioner of St. Greg's. Joe and his wife, Kim, are here only about a decade of years. In this relatively short time at St. Greg's Joe has "stepped up" to serve as a Eucharistic Minister and as a Special Minister to the Sick, especially at Suburban Hospital next door. Joe enthusiastically said "yes" to becoming a member of our parish Buildings and Grounds Committee when I began the advisory board for our parish property. Joe has served and continues to serve on our parish Finance Council and has been the Council's chair. Most substantially, Joe completely oversaw the renovation of our Church this year as well as the planning of the project. It had been twenty years since the interior of our church had been addressed. Joe stepped in and served as our project manager which was more than a full time, forty hour a week, job. Joe was that "one" person to constantly meet with all of our contractors and suppliers. He was the point person to meet with painters, restorers for our terrazzo floor, carpenters, those installing our carpets, lighting, and more. To this day Joe is still overseeing the final details like the black top repair that was accomplished just over a week ago. We will all be thankful to him as winter comes and our new heated sidewalks will ensure our safety. I believe we all know what it is like doing a remodeling project in our home. The many hours it takes to interview and discuss and compare proposals from several contractors for each part of the project as well as the oversight of the final details. I do not believe any of us can begin to imagine the scope and amount of time, talent and energy expended on a project of the magnitude of remodeling our worship space. Joe, we thank you and congratulate you for all you have done for us.

Finally, I wish to make you aware that in November I will be making a pilgrimage to the Holy Land with the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. As you know I am a Knight Commander with the Order. We have several parishioners who are also Knights and Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre, Eastern Lieutenancy. The Order was establish by the Holy Father in 1099 at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem and works to support the Christian presence in the Holy Land and most notably to support Catholic Education in the Holy Land. Pope Francis is our Sovereign and Edwin Cardinal O'Brien is our Grand Master. I will travel in pilgrimage along with Knights and Dames of the Order who are St. Gregory's parishioners and with other members of the Eastern Lieutenancy. We will be on pilgrimage to the many holy sites of the Holy Land in Jordan, Israel and Palestine as well as meet with our Grand Prior, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, and visit some of our schools that we work to fund and support. It is an honor and privilege to serve in this Order at the appointment of our Holy Father. Please pray for our safe journey and travel and please know that I will be praying for you and our St. Greg's family as I celebrate Mass daily in the various holy sites of the Holy Land.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.




KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS MASS OF REMEBRANCE


