

### MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF EVANGELIZATION

If you were put on trial for being a faithful Catholic, would there be enough evidence to find you guilty beyond a reasonable doubt? As the court prepares to present your case, they examine the physical evidence found in your home, at your work place, your daily activities, habits and attitudes. They look at your financial records and the time spent day by day to determine your priorities. Then they call the witnesses to either testify against you or on your behalf. The majority of them say you are nice to others, faithful to your spouse, attend church, provide for your family, work hard at your place of employment, give to charity, help others out when you can, avoid rough language and don't abuse alcohol or drugs. The judge, who is impartial, makes an observation before he passes down his sentence: "This is all well and good but what sets you apart from the hundreds of millions of non-Catholics in the world who do the same thing?"

Perhaps the judge is asking you to go deeper and examine your heart and intentions with sincere objectivity and honesty. "Why Am I Catholic?" Am I Catholic because I feel obligated, or because I love Jesus Christ? If it's strictly out of obligation, then the attitude associated with this may create a certain level of resentment and more than likely we will view our Faith as a bunch of rules we have to follow. If, however, we are Catholic because we love Jesus Christ, then we experience our Faith as a relationship. When we love someone, we want to know them better, we want to spend more time with them, we want to know what interests them, and we find ourselves willing to face the joys and struggles of life, together. When our hearts truly love, sacrifices, inconveniences and hardships are offered-up freely. Jesus invites us into this relationship with Him, not only

to know about Him (as you point to your head) but to personally know Him (as you point to your heart). Knowing Jesus is more than an intellectual exercise, it's a way of life

"Do you believe Jesus loves you?" Uh-huh, suuure he does, as you think back to your childhood days of butterfly banners with Christian verses. The love of Jesus is not a fluffy love but one that involved great sacrifice, inconvenience and hardship. And He freely did it out of love for you! Look at Him upon the Cross and tell me what He endured was fluffy love. He died for you so that your sins could be forgiven, to free you from the bondage of sin and offer you eternal life. When we know we are loved, we feel supported, we view the world more optimistically, we live our lives with confidence and in turn, we share our love with others. If we truly believe we are loved by Jesus then it stands to reason, we will act accordingly.

These questions are not meant to be 'gotcha' questions. These questions are meant to challenge you and invite you to reflect and grow in your Faith. No one needs to know the answers to these questions but you. Maybe you long for this relationship with Jesus but are not sure how to begin or build it. Maybe you've been disappointed, burned or hurt by the love the world offers, and to trust is difficult? Do you trust Him enough to let Him love you? I invite you to make a conscious and intentional decision to develop a relationship with Him. If you want to know who this Jesus Christ is, begin by picking up the Bible and turn to the Gospels of Mathew, Mark, Luke and John, put yourself in the story. Walk with Him as He shares His message of love, as He heals thousands and changes their lives. Let Him walk with you today to change your life. I pray for your conviction.

## BAPTISM, RECONCILIATION AND EUCHARIST FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Typically, children receive Baptism as infants and prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist when they are in Grades 2 and 3. When this does not happen, they need to be prepared for these Sacraments when they are older. At St. Greg's children and their families and/or sponsors are placed in a Children's Catechumenate and the process is called **RCIA** (**Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**). Through this process, older children who have missed Sacraments are prepared to receive them. Assisted Suicide and the Disabled: The National Council on Disability (NCD), an independent federal advisory agency, has released a scathing analysis of the effect of assisted suicide laws in

the United States on people with disabilities. It finds that safeguards are ineffective and that there is little oversight of abuses and mistakes.

Closely examining the experience in Oregon, where the practice has been legal for 20 years, NCD found that the list of conditions eligible for assisted suicide has expanded considerably over time, including many disabilities that, when properly treated, do not result in death, including arthritis, diabetes, and kidney failure.

The NCD report, titled Assisted Suicide Laws and their Danger to People with Disabilities, exposes the limitations of purported safeguards. It says that:

- \*Insurers have denied patients expensive, life-sustaining medical treatment, but offered to subsidize lethal drugs for them, potentially leading patients to hasten their own deaths;
- \*Misdiagnoses of terminal disease can cause frightened patients to hasten their deaths;
- \*Though fear and depression often drive requests for assisted suicide, referral for psychological evaluation is extremely rare prior to doctors writing lethal prescriptions;
- \*Financial and emotional pressures can distort patient choice;
- \*Patients may "doctor shop" limitlessly to find a physician who will obtain a colleague's concurrence and prescribe a lethal dose
- \*Evidence of suicide contagion in states where assisted suicide is legal has been found in several studies.

The NCD report points out that many national disability rights organizations oppose the legalization of assisted suicide. (Full text at nosuicideny.org)

ATTENTION: A bill legalizing assisted suicide in New York will be considered by the legislature beginning January 2020. The Catholic Church strongly opposes this legislation. Go to the Patients' Rights Action Fund website






