#### From The Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, as we celebrate this Sunday, we celebrate the Nativity of John the Baptist. This great Saint inspires us to live an ascetical life and to use our own life to point to Jesus Christ as he himself did. John was the last and greatest prophet to prepare the way for the Lord. St. John the Baptist was a fiery preacher but also had great humility as we remember he said: "I am not even worthy to unfasten the sandals of His (Jesus') feet." He also said that "He (Jesus Christ) must increase and I must decrease." This is humility.

As we begin summer, it is a good reminder to live a balanced life of summer fun with family and friends along with a renewal of our own life of prayer and simplicity. As we celebrate family reunions, barbeques, times at the cottage or beach or travel, we can also use a few moments to personally pray and even call those we are with to pray together. Humility is one of the most important keys to living a spiritual life rooted in Christ. Humility is also one of the more difficult virtues to pursue and make our own. It may be humbling to admit we need to work on humility and it is an act of humility lead an ascetical life of prayer.

Part of humility is realizing the power and action of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Last weekend, as you know, we dedicated the new plaques explaining the meaning of "Our Lady of Lourdes" at our Grotto in honor of the late Rose Hoelscher Rose was a long-time parishioner dedicated to our Blessed Mother, our Grotto and the traveling statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary. At the dedication on Sunday I was asked if I chose that date knowing that it was the feast day of St. Harvey and that Rose's late husband's name was Harvey. I did not know the feast date. Some would call it coincidence but I call it a God-incidence! With humility we will see and allow the Holy Spirit to work and give us great connections to each other and to the triune God! May God bless us as we work on humility.

By this weekend, I believe we are seeing the conclusion to the graduation season. One final "congratulation's" to all of our graduates! Congratulations to both those from St. Gregory the Great School and the Children of Mary Home Schoolers who celebrated their graduations at St. Greg's in the past couple weeks. Congratulations to all of our college, university and graduate school grads! Finally, many congratulations to all of our graduates from the many fine public and private schools in our area. We are blessed with many teens from many different schools at St. Greg's – we are proud of all of you!!

#### **Respect Life**

US Bishops' Statement on the DOJ's Implementation of Immigration Policies: From Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, USCCB President: "At its core, asylum is an instrument to preserve the right to life. The ...decision [to overturn asylum protection for domestic violence victims] elicits deep

concern because it potentially strips asylum from many women who lack adequate protection. These vulnerable women will now face return to the extreme dangers of domestic violence in their home country. This decision negates decades of precedents that have provided protection to women fleeing domestic violence. Unless overturned, the decision will erode the capacity of asylum to save lives, particularly in cases that involve asylum seekers who are persecuted by private actors. We urge courts and policy makers to respect and enhance...the potential of our asylum system to preserve and protect the right to life.

"Additionally, I join Bishop Joe Vásquez, Chairman of USCCB's Committee on Migration, in condemning the continued use of family separation at the U.S./Mexico border as an implementation of the Administration's zero tolerance policy. Our government has the discretion ... to ensure that young children are not separated from their parents and exposed to irreparable harm and trauma. Families are the foundational element of our society and they must be able to stay together. While protecting our borders is important, we can and must do better as a government, and as a society, to find other ways to ensure that safety. Separating babies from their mothers is not the answer and is immoral."

"But they had no child because Elizabeth was barren..." (Luke 1:7) God said to Zechariah, "Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son." (Luke 1:13) Perhaps you long for a child. Perhaps you already have a child or several. Regardless, ponder how your married love can reflect the love of God by supporting a child who is not your biological child.

#### **Parenting Perspective**

Discipline does not mean punishment. The purpose of discipline is to help your child learn to become responsible. Allow your child to experience the consequences of their actions. If a child chooses not to study for a test, she will get a poor grade. If they don't set their alarm, they may miss the school bus. These may seem like hard lessons, but better to learn them when the stakes are low than when your child is older and losing a job or damaging their vehicle might be the consequence.




