#### From the desk of Adoration Chapel

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration has been continuing at St. Gregory the Great parish since February 2, 2002 in our Adoration Chapel located between the Church and School. After many years of prayer and dedication, under the direction of Reverend William Quinlivan, Adoration began 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. For those who may not be familiar with Adoration, it is the exposition of Jesus Christ in the Monstrance with scheduled Adorers before Him around the clock, every day, in silence. Adorers may read Sacred Scrpture, pray the Rosary, pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, or avail themselves of the reading material we have in the Chapel. It is a time of reverence, concentrating the time on the True Presence of Jesus before them. Many people stop in throughout the day and just look at Jesus while He looks at them. It is a quiet way to escape the noise of the world.

When I come into the Adoration Chapel, it is like coming home to a Friend. I can count on Jesus to listen to my prayers. He is always there. My adoration times are always in the evening because for me it is a perfect way to end the day. Sometimes it's a quick 10 minute visit but most times it's longer because of the peace being in Jesus' presence brings.

Many stop in to say "hello" or "good night" to Jesus, or from the hospital next door. Jesus speaks to us in the silence of our hearts. The Bible, Diary of St. Faustina and Divine Intimacy are my favorite reads during Adoration.

A parishioner told me her 10 year old granddaughter saw many angels there on a recent visit. Where Jesus is multitudes of angels are there too.

## Respect Life

**Heartbeat Protection Act:** The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has endorsed legislation that would ban most abortions in the U.S.

The Heartbeat Protection Act would require abortionists to first test whether a fetal heartbeat is present. If they find one, they would be legally forbidden to perform the abortion. It allows an exception only for life-threatening physical circumstances (expressly rejecting exceptions for "psychological or emotional" health). Physicians who break the law would face up to five years in prison and/or a fine. Women seeking abortions would not be punished.

Cardinal Timothy Dolan, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, wrote in a letter supporting the legislation, "It is also due to scientific advances that we have the tools to hear the early heartbeat of the growing child. ... Accordingly, the Catholic Bishops applaud [the] efforts to recognize and protect these little ones in law while emphasizing that we need to continue to work for the protection of all lives, including those tiniest persons before a heartbeat is detectable."

The bill's lead sponsor, Rep. Steve King, R-IA, [said] that the *Heartbeat Protection Act*, which he calls the "single most supported piece of pro-life legislation pending before the House" with 174 cosponsors, is designed to "directly challenge *Roe v. Wade.*"

"I believe it would give the Supreme Court a solid constitutional foundation to overturn the illogical, ill-founded and heartless *Roe v. Wade* decision. ... For the first time in most of our adult lifetimes, we have a court that can be expected to constitutionally weigh the right to Life and deliver an objective decision to protect the beating hearts of the innocent unborn." Evening Prayer gives thanks for the day just past and makes an evening sacrifice of praise to God (see Psalm 141:1). Vespers, also called Evening Prayer, is part of the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office. In the Liturgy of the Hours, the Church fulfills Jesus' command to "pray always" (Luke 18:1; see also 1 Thessalonians 5:17).
